



1 How does an individual enroll in Kentucky Skills U (KYSU)?

Visit www.kyskillsu.ky.gov or text MyGED to 74700 to connect with a Kentucky Skills U center near you.

2 Is an individual required to take the practice test prior to the GED® exam?

Yes, GED® seekers are required to pass the GED Ready® Test prior to the GED exam. The GED® Ready test is available at no cost through Kentucky Skills U. The GED® Ready Practice test is also available online at www.ged.com for a fee.

3 Who qualifies for free GED® testing?

Individuals who are taking their first GED® exam in any subject qualify to have testing fees waived. Kentucky Skills U staff can assist with GED® prep prior to the exam.

4 How do you schedule a GED® test?

Visit www.GED.com to schedule the GED® test at a location near you. GED® seekers are required to pass the GED Ready® Test prior to the GED® exam. The GED® Ready test is available at no cost through Kentucky Skills U.

5 How many Kentucky Skills U centers are in Kentucky?

Kentucky Skills U offers adult education services at no cost in all 120 counties. Visit to www.kyskillsu.ky.gov or text MyGED to 74700 to connect with a Kentucky Skills U center near you.

6 What services are offered through Kentucky Skills U?

Kentucky Skills U provides adult education services to Kentuckians seeking to become college and career ready. Kentuckians can prepare for the GED®, transition to post-secondary education, career and training for employment. Adult education services are free of charge.

7 Is enrollment in Kentucky Skills U required?

No, individuals may take the GED Ready® test and use the free GED® promo code (KYFREEGED) online.

8 What type of funding is being used for this promotion?

State funds have been designated for student recruitment purposes.

9 How long will the promotion last?

The free GED® promotion is available to Kentuckians while funding lasts.

10 What services do you offer for Kentuckians with disabilities who want to get their GED®?

Testing accommodations are available for the GED® test for those with documented disabilities. Individuals with disabilities should specify the need for accommodations under the personal information in their profile at their MyGED® account at GED.com.

11 How many Kentuckians do not have a GED® or high school diploma?

Approximately 335,000 Kentuckians do not have a GED® or high school credential.

12 At what age can someone drop out of high school?

Kentucky's law requires students attend school until the age of 18.
